**TONIGHT'S GAME:** Australia can advance to its second straight WBC quarterfinals in one of two ways tonight in their final game of pool play versus Korea.

- ▶ The easiest (and most straightforward) scenario is to beat Korea and finish pool play at 3-1...the Aussies are 1-1 in WBC play all-time against tonight's opponent with the win coming in the 2023 WBC (8-7).
- ▶ It so happens that game took place three years ago today (March 9, 2023) here in Tokyo...trailing 4-2 entering the 7th inning, Australia scored three runs in the 7th and 8th innings to take an 8-4 lead...they withstood a three-run bottom of the 8th by Korea for the win.
- ▶ **UTL Robbie Glendinning, OF Tim Kennelly** and **C Robbie Perkins** all homered in that win for Australia.
- ▶ Korea entered this tourney as the No. 4 ranked team in the world in the WBSC standings...Australia entered at No. 11.

**THE LESS-EASY WAY:** Australia can also head to Miami even if they are defeated tonight by Korea given the tiebreaker set up but it then boils down to runs allowed and outs recorded.

- ▶ A loss would put the Aussies, Chinese Taipei and Korea all at 2-2...since neither of the three teams beat both of the other teams, the tiebreaker then moves on to the below.
- ▶ The three tied teams shall be ranked in the standings according to the lowest quotient of runs allowed divided by the number of defensive outs recorded in the games in that round *between the teams tied*.
- ▶ Entering this game (for reference), Australia has allowed 0 runs and recorded 27 outs (vs. TPE)...Korea has allowed 5 runs and recorded 30 outs (vs. TPE)...Chinese Taipei has allowed seven runs and recorded 54 outs (already played both Australia and Korea).

**SO CLOSE:** Australia fell a run shy in its 4-3 loss to Japan Sunday night after carrying a 1-0 lead into the 7th inning...a two-out, two-strike, two-run homer by Masataka Yoshida flipped the scoreboard for good.

- ▶ Two runs allowed in the 8th inning loomed large as well as **DH Alex Hall** and **IF Rixon Wingrove's** solo homers in the 9th weren't enough to tie the game.
- ▶ **RHP Connor MacDonald**, who converted to pitching in 2023, had the biggest start of his career last night and tossed 3.0 scoreless innings in a no-decision.

**HIGH VOLTAGE:** **C/DH Alex Hall** has two homers in this WBC and four in his WBC career.

- ▶ Hall's four career WBC homers (most by any Australian player in tourney history) are tied for seventh-most in WBC history...Cuba's Alfredo Despaigne has the most all-time home runs (seven).
- ▶ Of the 11 runs scored in this tournament by Australia, nine have come via the homer...since the start of the 2023 WBC, 52% of Australia's runs have come via a homer (22-of-43).

**TONIGHT'S STARTER:** **LHP Lachlan Wells** starts for Australia as they hope to punch their ticket to Miami for a trip to the quarterfinals.

- ▶ The 29-year-old will be making his first appearance in this year's tournament and playing in his third career WBC game...he made two relief outings for Australia in the 2017 WBC, allowing four runs in 2.2 innings.
- ▶ Last season, Wells made four starts with Kiwoom of the KBO as a temporary injury replacement and was 1-1 with a 3.15 ERA (7er, 20.0ip)...this past offseason he signed a contract with the LG Twins of the KBO.
- ▶ Both Wells and tonight's Korea starter, Ju Young Son, will play for the LG Twins in 2026.
- ▶ In Wells' last ABL season (2024-2025), he logged a 3.17 ERA (19er, 54.0ip) in 10 starts while going 5-1 with 66 strikeouts to 16 walks.
- ▶ Wells' brother, Alex, started Australia's first game of the tournament last Thursday vs. Chinese Taipei...they are the second set of brothers to each start a game in this tournament (also Antwone and Jaitoine Kelly of the Netherlands).
- ▶ The duo are one of seven sets of brothers competing on the same team in this WBC...the others are below courtesy of Sarah Langs

**A GAME OF CATCH:** Through three games of pool play, Australia's pitching staff has a team ERA of 1.73 (5er, 26.0ip), the lowest by any team that's played at least three games so far in this tournament.

- ▶ However, Australia's 12 walks in last night's loss to Japan were the second-most by an Aussie team in WBC history...they walked 13 in a game versus Venezuela on March 9, 2006 (a 2-0 loss).
- ▶ The 12 free passes yesterday are fifth-most by any team in a single game in WBC history...Brazil holds the top spot with 17 walks vs. the USA in their first game of this tourney.

**ODDS AND ENDS:** Captain **OF Tim Kennelly**, playing in his final WBC, is now Australia's leader in career WBC games played after appearing in three games so far in this tournament...he passed Brad Harman (12).

- ▶ Australia has used the same exact lineup for each of its first three games of this tourney but that could change tonight with a lefty starter on the mound.
- ▶ The Aussies' six team homers in the WBC are tied for second-most...only the Dominican Republic has more (seven).

## AUSTRALIAN BASEBALL HISTORY ▶

Baseball first arrived in Australia with American gold miners, who played the game during the 1850s. The first official baseball game was played in 1878 between Surry Baseball Club and the New South Wales Cricket Association.

Since that time, multiple tours by MLB teams have helped to promote the game throughout Australia. Australia's first professional league was established in 1989 with the original Australian Baseball League.

It ceased operations in 1999 but returned in 2010, where it still operates today. It has produced over 70 future Major League players, including the likes of Ronald Acuña Jr, and dozens of NPB / KBO stars. Along with this popularity, players like Dave Nilsson and Graeme Lloyd found success at the Major League level.

In 2004, the Australian national team further boosted the sport's profile by winning a silver medal at the Olympic Games. More recently, Australia achieved its best-ever World Baseball Classic result with a quarterfinal appearance in 2023.

The sport is currently experiencing strong growth at the grassroots level. More than 34,000 people now participate in organized baseball across Australia, representing growth of approximately 11 percent over the past two years. Australia also ranks among the leading countries worldwide in Little League participation. Major League Baseball opened its own academy in 2001 and currently helps fund the Australian Baseball League.

In 2014, Sydney hosted Major League Baseball's season-opening series between the Los Angeles Dodgers and Arizona Diamondbacks. In total, 38 Australian players have played in the Major Leagues. There are over 100 Australians who play college baseball in the United States.

## THE UNIFORM ▶



Australian teams wear the green and gold because those are the country's national colors.

**Gold** - is a symbol of Australia's sporting victories and the color of their mineral wealth, beaches and golden fleece of Australian wool and the harvests of gold grains across the state.

**Green** - is the color of the Australian forests, gum trees, pastures and the endless horizons of growing crops.

Australia's national colors of green and gold are also those of the golden wattle in flower.

## AUSTRALIA IN THE WORLD BASEBALL CLASSIC ▶

### 2006 World Baseball Classic

**Pool D** (Lake Buena Vista, FL, USA)

**Record:** 0-3

Competing in the inaugural WBC, Australia was blanked in its first two games by Italy (10-0) and Venezuela (2-0). In the club's third game, they scored their first runs in a 6-4 loss to the Dominican Republic. Brett Roneberg is credited with driving in the first run in Australia's WBC history, using a sacrifice fly to drive in Trent Durrington in the 1st inning of that contest. Current Australia Manager **Dave Nilsson** played in that WBC as did current Third Base Coach **Andrew Graham**.

### 2009 World Baseball Classic

**Pool B** (México City, MEX)

**Record:** 1-2

Australia won its first-ever World Baseball Classic Game right out of the gate with a 17-7 drubbing of host-country México in their first game of the 2009 tournament on March 8. They pounded out 22 hits with the game ending due to the mercy rule. Current Third Base Coach **Andrew Graham** was part of the offensive attack, going 4-for-6 with three RBI and two runs scored in the win.

Unfortunately they couldn't escape pool play for a second consecutive tournament after losing the next two games to Cuba (5-4) and México (16-1).

### 2013 World Baseball Classic

**Pool B** (Taichung, Taiwan)

**Record:** 0-3

Thanks to its win in the 2009 tournament over México, Australia automatically qualified for the '13 edition of the Classic. They once again, however, failed to win a game during pool play in Taiwan. They lost 4-1 to Chinese Taipei in Game 1, 6-0 to Korea in Game 2 and 4-1 to the Netherlands in their third and final game.

### 2017 World Baseball Classic

**Pool B** (Tokyo, Japan)

**Record:** 1-2

The Aussies needed to re-qualify for the '17 Classic and did so by winning all three of their games in the qualifying round that was held in Sydney at Blacktown International Sportspark. They defeated the Philippines in the first round before defeating South Africa twice to return to the main tournament.

Their second-ever WBC tournament win came in Game 2 of the 2017 tourney with a 11-0 blanking of China. That leveled their record at 1-1 (they lost their first game to Japan 4-1) and set up a chance to advance to the second round with a win over Cuba.

After jumping out to a 1-0 lead in the 5th inning following 4.0 scoreless innings from **RHP Warwick Saupold**, Cuba scored four in the bottom of the 5th and hung on for a 4-3 win.

### 2023 World Baseball Classic

**Pool B** (Tokyo, Japan)

**Record:** 3-2 (Lost in Quarterfinals to Cuba)

The Green & Gold put together its best WBC showing to date by advancing out of pool play for the first time after going 3-1 with wins over South Korea (8-7), China (12-2) and the Czech Republic (8-3). Australia's only blemish in pool play came at the hands of the Samurai Japan in a 7-1 defeat.

With a trip to the United States on the line in the quarterfinals, Australia faced a familiar foe in Cuba. Like in 2017, the Aussies jumped out to a 1-0 lead but saw Cuba tie the game at one in the bottom of the 3rd inning. Cuba added three more in the fifth but Australia got right back in the game with a two-run homer from **IF Rixon Wingrove** in the 6th inning.

Australia scored no further, however, and another tightly-contested WBC match with Cuba went to the Cubans.


