
FROM THE CHAIRMAN

MATCH PREVIEW & SERIES REVIEW



Nobody at the Alcohol. Think Again Perth Heat have forgotten losing last year's championship series to the Brisbane Bandits and now a chance for vengeance presents at Harley-Davidson Ballpark this weekend.

The Heat return home for the first series of 2020 on the back of last week's road series in Sydney against the Blue Sox, and it's a tantalising match up against the defending ABL champion Bandits.

That made it four straight Claxton Shield triumphs for the Bandits and again this season they are looming as one of the teams to beat, but this weekend provides a chance to make a statement for the Heat.

Clearly having played off in last season's championship series, the two teams are no stranger to one another and 13 Heat players took part in it, including John Anderson.

He pitched in Game 1 of the series and still has strong memories of it and gave the Bandits ultimately a lot of credit.

"I remember that series pretty vividly. It was a battle of starting pitchers and all about who can overcome small errors and small mistakes," Anderson said.

"They did everything right. They played good defence. They put the ball in play, and their starting pitching was pretty good."

Bandits ace Tim Atherton worked eight innings with 10 strikeouts in Game 2 and was named as series MVP in the end. Andrew Campbell and Wade Dutton both homered in the series and remain the key players for the Bandits this season.

The explosive offence of the Bandits was the key to winning the championship last season as they led the league with 68 home runs. On top of that squad, they were able to add former Mariners catcher Mike Marjama to the roster.

The Heat need some quality pitching to hold this group off but that hasn't been an issue so far. "Our strength has been the pitching," said Heat manager Brooke Knight.

"Our starting pitching has been outstanding with Unsworth, Anderson and Lourey. Hendrickson also had a couple of nice outings. They are giving us every opportunity to win."

The batters are also providing crucial run support. Robbie Glendinning, Niko Hulsizer and Jordan Qsar have produced plenty of highlights with their bats so far this season.

But there's no doubting the significance and importance of this series against Brisbane.

"I feel like our entire season all leads to playing them in the playoffs and we want some vengeance," Anderson said.

"If we can minimize small mistakes and capitalize any gifts we receive, I think that would be the difference in the series."

DYLAN UNSWORTH

While in the big picture star South African pitcher Dylan Unsworth hopes a strong ABL season earns him another crack at Major League Baseball, before that his focus is on helping Perth Heat win a championship.

The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher has joined the Heat for the 2019/20 ABL season after a brief stint playing with Caracas in Venezuela having gone ever so close to a Major League call up while signed to the LA Angels and producing a 6-1 AAA record with the Salt Lake Bees.

It was his first season signed by the Angels having spent the previous nine years with the Seattle Mariners and now what Unsworth is hoping to get from starring with Heat in the ABL is a return to the minor leagues first of all, and ultimately a crack at Major League Baseball.

You certainly wouldn't deny him that possibility with the stunning way he has started the season down under. Unsworth has produced some dominant, impressive and clever pitching.

"I was in AAA last year and had a 6-1 record so I was very close to getting a call up. After spending nine years with the Mariners, I signed with the Angels as a free agent and I got very close, but things happen in baseball and nothing come of it for me in the end," Unsworth said.

"I did originally sign to play in Venezuela when Tyler (Anderson) called me up and told me he really believed in me. He said he knew I'd dominate the league and he wanted me to just trust him that it would be the best thing for my career.


"Now here I am competing as hard as I can and seeing where that takes me. Hopefully after the ABL something comes up and some team believes in me to sign me again. I'll see where it takes me from there but I'm 27 so I am in my prime and at my peak right now so I'm obviously not giving up."

While it's only natural for a 27-year-old pitcher to have lofty individual goals, what he's loving about the baseball in Australia already is the team chemistry and that's why helping the Heat winning a championship would be so meaningful.

"When Tyler and Brooke heard about me and wanted to bring me over here, Tyler told me that Perth have revamped the stadium and they want to win the championship. That was a team I wanted to be part of," Unsworth said.

"I've won a championship in AA in Jackson, Tennessee with the Mariners and I know that feeling so to win the championship is obviously a great experience. I'm very competitive and I have that never-ending energy where I want to keep going no matter how many times I get knocked down.

"I feel like this team is one where we're not going to stop. There might be a couple of bad games but the next day comes out and we're ready to play ball. I feel like everybody's on the same path and just ready to roll with it."

OUR OPPONENTS

BRISBANE BANDITS

Brisbane Bandits are the powerhouse of Australian baseball as they have claimed the last four ABL titles. Last season, they defeated Perth Heat in the championship series with a 3-2 win on the road and a 9-4 win at home. Tim Atherton was named as the series MVP. He pitched 8 innings with 10 strikeouts in Game 2.

Nine Bandits players were selected to represent Team Australia in the Premier 12. It's the highest among all ABL teams. Atherton started three games during the tournament and claimed the win against USA. Logan Wade and Mitch Nilsson have also been the key players of the team.

Dave Nilsson has been the manager of Brisbane Bandits since 2014. He led the team to championship in 4 of 5 seasons. Nilsson played for Milwaukee Brewers from 1992 to 1999 as a catcher and competed in the 2000 and 2004 Olympic Games. In 2008 Nilsson was named to the Sport Australia Hall of Fame.

The four-time defending champion had a slow start to this season as they were swept by Adelaide Giants in Round 1. But Dave Nilsson's team was able to bounce back and click into gear thanks to their strong pitching. Other than Atherton, Travis Blackley and Cory Taylor have been great on the mound. They are supported by a strong bullpen which features Australian representatives Sam Holland and Ryan Searle.
