# MATCH PREVIEW & SERIES REVIEW



After starting the Australian Baseball League strongly in Auckland, the Alcohol. Think Again Perth Heat open the 2019/20 at Harley-Davidson Ballpark this week with a blockbuster series against the Canberra Cavalry.

The Heat and Cavalry are perennial powerhouses in ABL and after both reached the playoffs a season ago, this series in Perth will provide an early glimpse into how they are shaping up to start the new campaign.

The Heat already have one away series and four games under their belt for the new season, and there was a lot to like about what happened in Auckland last week.

The Heat won three of the four matches against the Tuatara starting with South African pitcher Dylan Unsworth dominating Game 1 with 10 strikeouts while last season's Rookie of the Year Robbie Glendinning hit two homeruns in four games.

Perth won on Thursday 6-1 before backing up with a 1-0 victory on Friday. It was then a 5-2 loss on Saturday despite four hits still from the Heat and they bounced back on Sunday to win 6-1 in a dominant display including 12 hits to two and no errors.

The Heat now look to set alight Harley-Davidson Ballpark against the Cavalry starting Friday night before the double-header on Saturday, and fourth and final game of the series on Sunday.

The Cavalry opened their 2019/20 season last week at home to the Melbourne Aces, splitting the four-game series with two wins apiece.

Canberra started the season with strong offensive performances to secure two wins against Melbourne. They scored 15 runs in the first two games, but lost Games 3 and 4 despite Australian representative pitchers Dushan Ruzic and Steven Kent at the mound.

They will try to bounce back against the Heat.

Now this week, the home crowd for the Heat can expect to see seven exciting prospects from the Tampa Bay Rays.

Blake Bivens, Audry Lugo and Carlos Garcia showed excellent pitching in the first series and didn't give up any runs while right-handed slugger Niko Hulsizer blasted the first home run of the season.

Jordan Qsar, Kaleo Johnson and Roberto Alvarez led the team with four hits apiece. They will be powerful weapons for the Heat this season.

"I think anytime you go on the road, if you can get three out of four games, you will obviously be happy about it," Heat Manager Brooke Knight said.

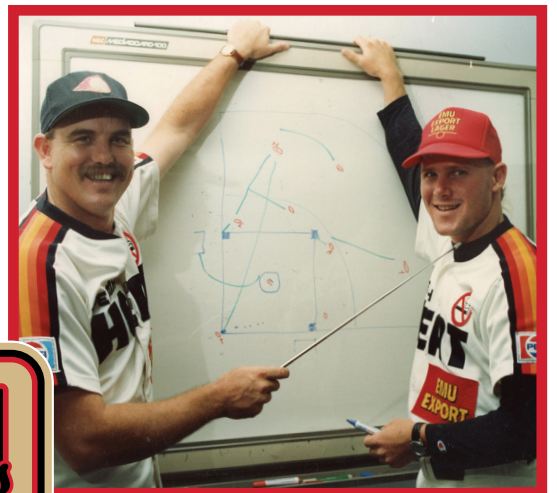
"We've got to get the bats going a little better and the confidence of what we're capable of, which I don't necessarily think we showed."

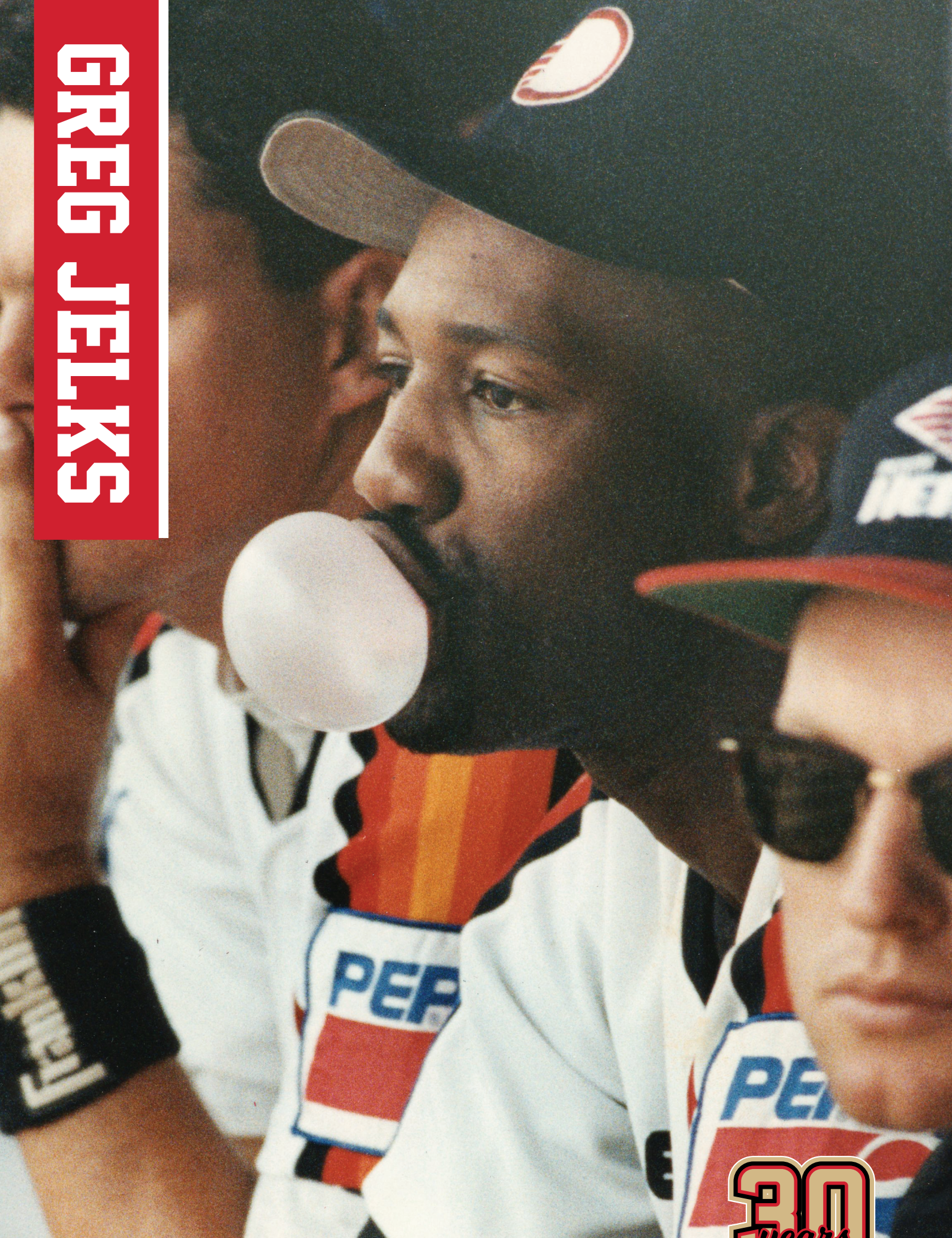

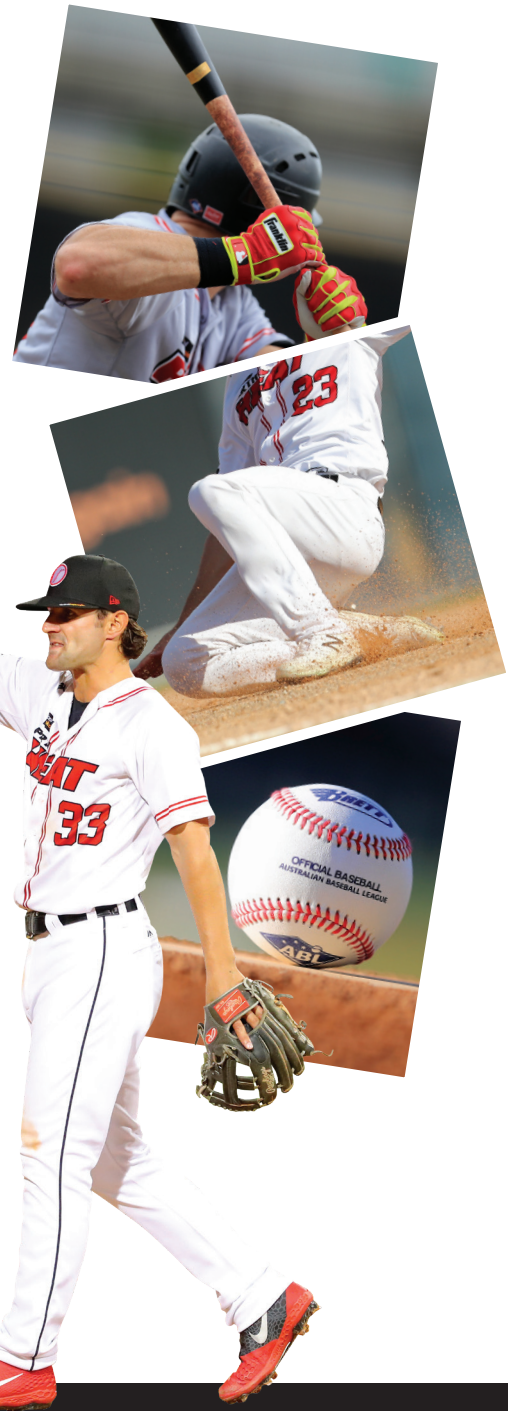

# BASEBALL FOR BEGINNERS

Our #1 ticket holder Spider shares his baseball guide for beginners!

1. An **INNING** is complete when each team records three outs
2. **HIT** – when a batter reaches base by putting the ball into play without a fielder committing an **ERROR** – when a fielder misplay a ball and allows batter-runner to reach one or more additional bases.
3. **3 strikes** = strikeout **4 balls** = base on balls (BB) **3 outs** = side away
4. **K** – strikeout swinging **□** – strikeout looking  
**FOUL BALL** – a ball that is determined to not be within the first and third base lines (field of play)
5. **FORCE PLAY** – any attempt by the fielding team to put out a runner who is forced to advance bases  
**TAG PLAY** – any play in which a baserunner (who is not on a base at the time) is out because he is touched by the fielder's hand or glove holding the ball
6. **FLY BALL** – a ball hit in the air, usually very high  
**GROUND BALL** – a batted ball that rolls or bounces on the ground  
**GROUND OUT** – a batted ball that hits the ground in fair territory, but a member of the fielding team is able to gain possession of the ball and touch 1st base before the batter-runner arrives
7. **DOUBLE PLAY** – the act of making two outs during the same continuous playing action. A **TRIPLE PLAY** is the act of making three outs during the same continuous playing action
8. **HOME RUN** – when a batter is able to circle the bases all in one play without any errors being committed by the fielding team  
**RBI** (Run Batted In) – when the outcome of the batter's plate appearance results in a run being scored  
**RUN SCORED** – is awarded when a player advances from 1st, 2nd and 3rd base and returns safely to home plate, touching the bases in that order, before three outs are recorded
9. **SACRIFICE FLY** – is a fly ball that results in an out, which allows a runner to tag up and score a run  
**SACRIFICE BUNT** – is a bunt (soft hit) that advances a runner but results in an out
10. **PERTH HARLEY-DAVIDSON BALLPARK DIMENSIONS:**  
Left field: 330ft (100m); Centerfield: 370ft (113m); Right field: 330ft (100m)  
Home to 1st base: 90ft (27m); and home to pitcher's mound: 60ft 6in (18m)



And a reminder Spider will be selling his catch cards all summer on the main concourse.  
Each catch card is just \$1 with all proceeds donated back to community programs and the grassroots.





# LET'S MEET OUR TAMPA PROSPECTS

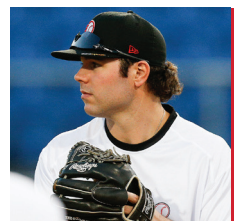


## Carlos GARCIA

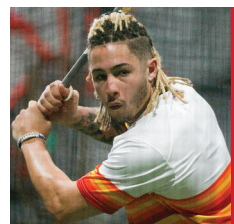


## Kaleo JOHNSON

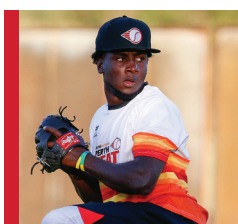


## Jordan QSAR

# OUR OPPONENTS

## CANBERRA CAVALRY

The **Canberra Cavalry** baseball club was founded in 2010 and this young franchise have quickly achieved remarkable results.

In the 2012/13 ABL season, the Cavalry won the ABL championship only two years after the foundation by defeating a strong Perth Heat. In the last two years, Canberra have finished the regular season in third place, but failed to win the championship. This year, they have bigger plans.

The Cavalry's roster has been strengthened this season thanks to their affiliation with major league and Japanese league teams. The Yokohama DeNA Baystars have sent four pitchers to Canberra who have combined for 135 games played in NPB. Meanwhile, the roster will also feature four prospects from San Diego Padres: Jordy Barley, Jawuan Harris, Kelvin Melean, and Taylor Kohlwey. These young bloods will give the Cavalry spark..

Along with the new faces, Canberra has also re-signed key players like outfielder David Kandilas and pitcher Steve Kent. Kandilas had one of the most dominant seasons in Cavalry history in 2017/18 with 12 homeruns while Kent started on the mound with a league-highest 7 wins last season. Catcher Robbie Perkins will also start his 8th season with the Cavalry after competing in the Premier 12 for the Team Australia.
